Roche Street update

With about three months of work done, the **seismic strengthening and refurbishment** project for 135 Roche Street is running smoothly.

Progress to date includes:

- Scaffolding/shrink wrapping installed
- Old roof cladding removed
- Construction of the new structural plywood diaphragm over much of the roof area including the annex area completed
- Removal of old steel window frames and replacement with new aluminium frames to the chambers open plan office area
- Concrete infill wall lintels, boxing and installation of reinforcement for infill shear walls completed
- Timber framing for roof structure underway
- · Delivery of timber trusses for roof completed
- · Construction of wall opening for internal museum lift completed
- · Mechanical services installation commenced in museum ceiling space
- Timber wall framing installed inside the museum area.

The next steps include roof framing work and the installation of roof trusses, more window replacements and the installation of mechanical services in the museum ceiling space.

Cambridge Water Tower

After the dangerous metalwork was removed from the outside of the upper level late last year, we have decontaminated the inside and carried out sampling and testing of the brick work and mortar.

The measured strength of the tower materials will be used to complete a new detailed seismic assessment ready for peer review due to be completed by mid-March. Preliminary design and costing of strengthening options will follow.

Waipā Tech Meetups

The first of our **new series of tech meetups** was a great success – held in partnership with Rocketspark and regional business partner SODA Inc.

This was on the back of our adoption of the Anchor Institution Framework and implementation plan last year, which resulted in discussions about supporting and growing industry clusters. A pilot series of four Waipa Tech Meetups was planned, and the first event held on Wednesday February 12 was a resounding success, with more than 65 people attending to hear Cambridge-based tech entrepreneur David Booth present on accessing venture capital and alternative methods of capital raising for new tech ventures.

One outcome of the first meetup was the formation of a smaller group of local venture capitalists who can collectively support the development of emerging local tech businesses.

The second event is being held at Storyteller Bar in Te Awamutu on Thursday April 3. <u>Registrations</u> <u>are open here.</u>

Once the series is complete in June, we will evaluate the outcomes before committing to continue. The aim of the organisers is to pass the future running of the Tech Meetups over to the cluster itself, ensuring continuing organic growth.
