The Electoral Amendment Bill will change the Electoral Act and implement the recommendations from the Justice Committee's review of the 2023 General Election. Key changes will include:

- closing enrolment earlier and allowing the Electoral Commission to automatically update enrolment details using information from other government agencies
- enabling the validation and qualification of special votes to begin before election day
- creating a single deadline for candidate nominations
- exempting political parties with election expenses under \$50,000 from audit requirements
- expanding offences for bribery, treating, and undue influence to cover enrolment decisions
- expanding the Electoral Commission's board from three to up to seven members
- removing occupation and honorific details from voter information provided to local authorities
- changing requirements for how the Electoral Commission must deliver notices.
